Esther, now 20 years old, was taken in by Bethlehem Community Centre in 2006 when she was in year 2 at school. Her father died of kidney failure when she was 2 years old. Esther and her 4 older siblings continued to live with their mum on the outskirts of Nairobi and then near the Ugandan border. Her mum worked in other people's shamba (farms/plots) and she built a thatched grassy muddy house. Her brothers and sister left school due to financial struggles.

Esther gained 339/500 for her high school entrance and went to St Cecelia Nangina Girls Secondary School. She is now studying a Diploma in Special needs Education at Kenyatta Uni which is sponsored by Friends of BCC.

Esther is in regular contact through Facebook. Her accommodation is a room shared with 3 others and they must provide their own bedding. Food is not provided and no cooking is allowed in the rooms so it must be purchased outside with your own funds.

Mary Wakuthii

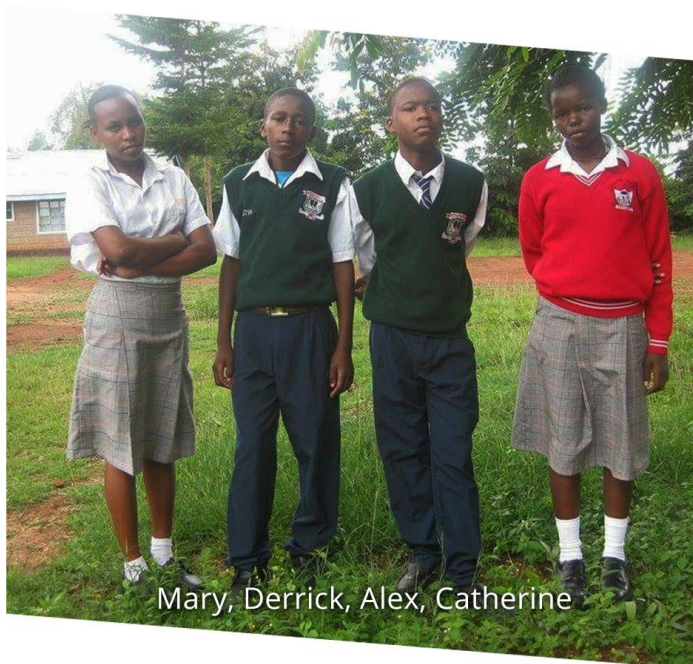
